Let's All Have "Chocolate for Lent"

Giving up chocolate for Lent is a favorite off-the-cuff joke around the water cooler at work or in our quick phone conversations. It says a lot about how we dance all around the issue of how we want to face the most holy Christian seasons of Lent and Easter without really directly facing their meaning at all. I'm not sure where the idea of giving up some favorite food for Lent originated—in the Middle Ages, I suspect—but it distorts the real meaning of Lent, which should be a season of preparation for celebrating the Good News of Easter morning.

There are many aspects to spiritual preparation. Only one of the traditional Lenten disciplines involves sacrificing and self-denial. Truly, we should be practicing these spiritual disciplines year-round, not just lightly at Lent, so that we are constantly aware of our American lifestyles of abundance to the point of excess and waste.

Many of us choose a significant food or activity to sacrifice during lent; but, like our New Year's resolutions, they almost always go by the wayside as our demanding secular lives take precedence.

This year, I invite you to use the season of Lent to prepare in a way that honors the spiritual discipline of sacrifice and denial, but also in a way that **adds** to your spiritual strength and fellowship with other Christians. I invite you to join me in sacrificing one short hour each week for a Lenten study entitled "**Chocolate for Lent**"

"**Chocolate for Lent**" is based on the celebrated movie "Chocolat." So, we will be watching the movie and having interesting discussions as we prepare our lives for God's will to unfold in our lives anew, so that we will be refreshed and inspired for the renewed direction of our church ministry in 2008.
